SUMMARY

Included for your information are the gender updates for the 4th quarter of 2021. This report tracks and documents the number of female firefighters by seniority, classification, and ethnicity. The data reflects changes from October through December 31, 2021. Also included in this report is a breakdown of the number of women hired and assigned to each Drill Tower class since January 1, 2014, and their status. The total percentage of female firefighters in the Department is currently at 3.5%.



DISCUSSION

SENIORITY

As of November 30, 2021, the most senior female firefighter has 37 years with the Department. The following table depicts the number of women by seniority in years on the job:



CLASSIFICATION

Currently, there are 117 sworn women employed by the Department. The classification of female firefighters by rank is depicted in the table below:

The total number of women hired since 2014 is 119. With an average retention rate of 53%, 63 of the 118 women hired are currently employed by the Department.

CONCLUSION

The Department remains committed to increasing the number of sworn women within its ranks and has maintained a steady increase since January of 2014. Consistent with this goal, notwithstanding the loss of five women through resignations and retirement, the Department hired 11 women in the year 2021. Class 21-1 started with seven females, three resigned. Class 21-2 started with five females. Four of those women are still active.
