SUMMARY

This report outlines the fire prevention activities for the calendar year 2021 for all sections in the Fire Prevention and Public Safety Bureau (FPB).

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board: Receive and File.

DISCUSSION

By utilizing a weekly and monthly FireStat process, FPB has transitioned to a data-driven and metric-based Bureau by capturing and tracking efficiency levels. These actions have provided the FPB and Emergency Operations with the ability to plan, organize and project fire prevention metrics on a weekly, monthly, quarterly or annual basis.

INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL SECTION Inspections

The Industrial and Commercial Section Battalion Chief is responsible for ensuring compliance with the fire code during maintenance and enforcement inspections of all industrial and commercial occupancies, high-rise buildings and brush inspections. Data was collected from the Fire Prevention Application (FPA) and reflects inspections completed for the 2021 calendar year.

Currently, 8,274 (93%) of these inspections have been completed for the 2021 calendar year. Re-inspections or follow up to inspections are critical to ensure compliance is met regarding fire life safety violations.

Oil Wells Management Plan

In 2021, progress continued on the aggressive training program to augment and provide additional Harbor Industrial Unit (HIU) inspectors. Training multiple inspectors provided the support needed to eliminate any "single point of failure within the Section".

The separation of Oil Wells inspections from the HIU/FPA annual report yielded the accurate identification of performance and deployment that was expected. The established plan has set the tone for the 2022 expansion of the Oil Wells Unit under the Administrative Section equipped with a Captain I, three additional Inspector I's and a Management Analyst.

FIRE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES SECTION

The Fire Development Services Section is overseen by a civilian Senior Fire Protection Engineer and is responsible for ensuring compliance with the fire code during plan reviews, new construction inspections and tenant improvement inspections.

Due to public counter closures and the development of an electronic plan check process, the counter wait time statistics and data from Q-Matic does not reflect the typical data for the unit. The Q-matic data tables for the 2021 calendar year have therefore been omitted from this report.

Despite public counter closures and longer wait times due to COVID-19, the implementation of the electronic plan check provided virtual counter access to its customers. It increased digital plan submissions, reduced the exchange of physical plans, and streamlined the communication and permit process across city agencies.

The Administrative Section is overseen by a Battalion Chief and is responsible for ensuring compliance with Regulation 4 (Reg. 4) testing, unwanted alarm tracking, illegal storage, court hearings and criminal filings concerning fire and life safety violations. The Legal Unit works closely with the City Attorney's Office to bring building owners into compliance for all fire and life safety violations.

There has been a dramatic increase in legal cases submitted as the department emphasizes compliance and holds building owners accountable for deficient fire protection systems and outstanding fire/life safety violations.

The majority of the Reg. 4 hearings relate to fire protection systems out of compliance, and overdue anniversary dates provided by The Compliance Engine (Brycer).
