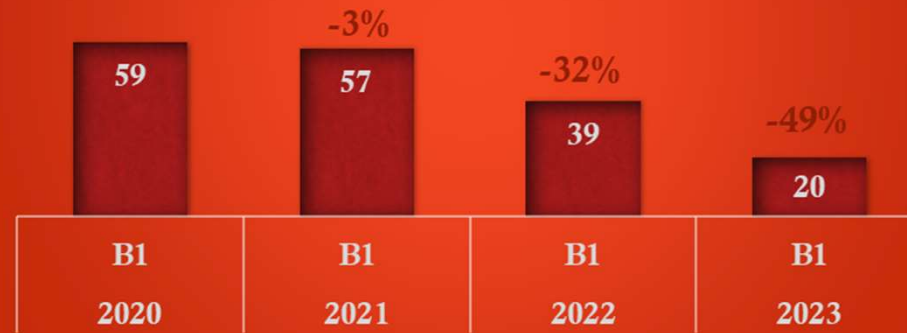

Number of Injuries by OCB Battalion 2020-YTD



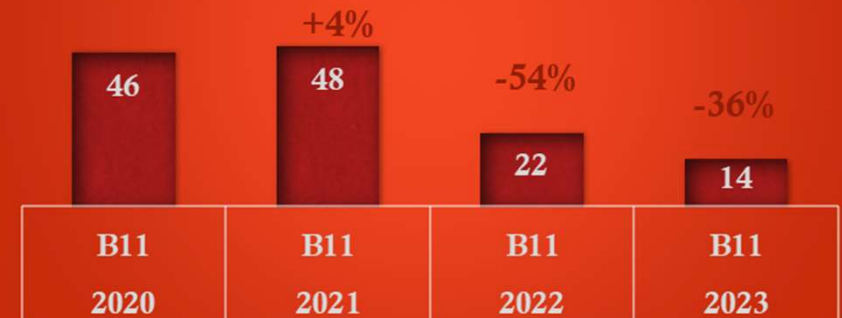
Battalion 1 Number of Injuries 2020-YTD
