### **Recommendations:**

The following recommendations are submitted to the Board for consideration and public hearing. In accordance with Sections 57.04.12, Subsection C of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (L.A.M.C.), which authorizes the Board to modify fees based on the cost of services, these recommendations have been reviewed and concurred by the City Administrative Officer. Pursuant to the requirements of the Fiscal Year 2007-08 Adopted Budget, the Office of the City Attorney has prepared an ordinance amending Section 57.04.12, Subsection C of the L.A.M.C. to allow the Board to modify verifiable costs at anytime through the fiscal year. The ordinance shall be effective July 26, 2007. It is recommended that:

- 1. The fees charged for Continuing Permits Activities (L.A.M.C., Section 57.04.12C) be increased approximately 17 percent as listed in Attachment A.
- 2. The fees charged for Non-Continuing Permit Activities and Emergency Inspections (L.A.M.C., Sections 57.05.31 and 57.05.32) be increased approximately 17 percent as listed in Attachment B.
- 3. The Miscellaneous Fees (L.A.M.C., Sections 57.01.28, 57.01.30, 57.05.14, 57.05.15, and 57.06.15) be increased approximately 17 percent as listed in Attachment C.

- 4. The Board's Executive Assistant be directed to publish the required notice of public hearing on the proposed fee increase at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.
- 5. The attached Resolution (Attachment D) adjusting the Board controlled fees be adopted after the required public hearing, and notice of this action be transmitted by the Board's Executive Assistant to the Mayor and City Council at the conclusion of the public hearing.
- 6. The Board's Executive Assistant be directed to publish the Resolution based on Mayor and City Council action.

### **Summary:**

The recommended fee adjustments are based on the most recent cost-recovery schedule in accordance with Section 57.04.12 Subsection C of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (L.A.M.C.), and in compliance with the City's financial policies for full cost recovery (C.F. 04 –1822).

The hourly rate for the cost of special services is determined from the cost of staff to perform these services. The proposed Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Salaries and Cost Allocation Plan 29 indirect cost rates were used in the computation of the hourly rate. Based on the latest staffing costs, the hourly rate of \$158 is recommended, an increase of approximately 17 percent from the current hourly rate of \$135. This increase is primarily attributable to the increase in the overhead costs. The Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) overhead rate increased from 72.42 percent in Fiscal Year 2006-07 to 96.44 percent in Fiscal Year 2007-08. The hourly rate was last updated July 2006.

The fees for special services are computed based on the average time involved in an inspection activity multiplied by the hourly rate of inspection. The average time involved in an inspection activity is based on historic data of staff hours spent on specific related activities. These hours are reviewed and adjusted annually.

The following sections of the L.A.M.C. pertain to the recommended fee adjustments:

1. Continuing Permit Activities – L.A.M.C., Section 57.04.12 – Permit Processing and Annual Permit Inspection.

Division 4 of the City of Los Angeles Fire Code identifies certain occupancies and operations, which require an annual continuing permit issued by the City. There are 28 categories of occupancies and operations under Division 4, and the proposed annual permit fees to be charged for these occupancies range from \$237 for an aircraft refueler truck to \$1,738 for a refinery. Attachment A of this report contains a listing of Division 4 permit fees recommended for adjustment based on the Fiscal

Year 2007-2008 cost-recovery schedule. This schedule is based on CAP rates which are used Citywide to compute benefit and overhead costs.

2. Non-Continuing Permit Activities – L.A.M.C., Sections 57.05.31 and 57.05.32.

Division 5 of the Fire Code identifies certain installations or operations of a one-time or non-continuing nature, which require plan checks and/or inspections. These permits are issued for a wide variety of activities including firework displays, live-theater productions, and the transfer of flammable liquids. The proposed fees for Division 5 activities range from \$316 for a permit for a central station signaling system to \$3,318 for drilling a core hole over 1,500 feet. Attachment B details the existing fees and the recommended revision of Division 5 permit fees.

3. Miscellaneous Divisions 1, 5, and 6 Activities (L.A.M.C., Sections 57.01.28, 57.01.30, 57.05.14, 57.05.15, and 57.06.15).

A number of miscellaneous activities within Divisions 1, 5, and 6 of the Fire Code are under the Board's fee-setting authority. These include General Approvals sought by manufacturers of specified items, fees for conducting tests to certify non-specified items, variance and waivers from provisions of the Fire Code; and Certificates of Fitness issued to individuals engaged in the recharging of fire extinguishers, in conducting blasting operations, or certifying the installation of fire protection equipment. Recommended fees are detailed in Attachment C and reflect the approximate 17 percent increase in computed costs.

On May 15, 2007, the Board approved the collection of fees for the plan check and inspection services of methane gas detection systems and for the certification of persons performing gas detection system testing. The permit fee for the plan check and inspection of gas detection systems has been added to the attached fee schedule under L.A.M.C., Section 57.05.31A. The fee for certification of persons performing gas detection system testing has been added to the attached fee schedule under L.A.M.C., Section 57.06.15A. These new fees will become effective upon Council and Mayor approval and upon revision of the L.A.M.C. to include provisions for the collection of fees for methane gas detection systems.

Effective January 1, 1998, any proposed fee enactment change requires a public hearing at which oral and written presentations can be made as part of a regularly scheduled meeting. Prior to the hearing, notification must be published. The fees established by the Board, through the adoption of recommendations contained in this report, can be modified as a result of the public hearing to be conducted by the Board.

Although the Board has authority, with the concurrence of the City Administrative Officer, to adjust the previously detailed fees, the Mayor and Council have 60 days to review the fees adopted by the Board. If the Mayor and Council take no action within

this 60-day period, the Resolution adopted by the Board will be published through the Board's Office and the new fees will become effective upon publication.

## **Conclusion:**

Increasing the fees would provide for full cost recovery and be consistent with existing City financial policies of recovering the total cost of providing specialized services. The revenue projection for these various permits for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 would increase by more than 17 percent to a projected \$4 million.

Whenever an application for renewal is filed prior to the expiration date of a General Approval, the renewal fee shall be 50% of the fee set forth in Section 57.05.15 of the article.

## **ADDITIONAL COSTS**

Section 57.05.15 (B) of the Municipal Code provides that when the cost of investigations of an application for a General Approval exceeds the General Approval fee based on current hourly costs, that an additional fee must be paid to the Department before any General Approval is issued.

## ATTACHMENT D RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, Section 57.04.12 Permit Fees., Subsection C., of the Los Angeles Municipal Code authorizes the Board of Fire Commissioners to determine on a regular basis, with the concurrence of the City Administrative Officer, the schedule of applicable charges necessary to recover City costs for issuing numerous permits; and

WHEREAS, these permits include Continuing Permits (Division 4), Non-Continuing Permits (Division 5), and Emergency Inspection Fees as identified in the Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 57.04.12.C, 57.05.31, and 57.05.32 respectively, and also include various miscellaneous permit related activities as identified in Los Angeles Municipal Code, Sections 57.01.28, 57.01.30, 57.05.14, 57.05.15, and 57.06.15; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners at its meeting of August 7, 2007 adopted a recommended fee schedule for permits and activities for which it has been given authority to establish fees; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 57.04.12, Subsection C, of the Los Angeles Municipal Code, the City Administrative Officer, Mayor, and City Council have reviewed and concurred with the recommended fees;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT BE RESOLVED, that the BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS adopts the following schedule of fees. (See L.A.M.C. for complete text)
