THE CENTRAL LOS ANGELES AREA PLANNING COMMISSION MEETINGS CAN BE LISTENED TO BY DIALING (213) 621-2489 OR (818) 904-9450. IF YOU WISH TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MEETING AND OFFER PUBLIC COMMENT, PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS.

Only members of the public who wish to offer public comment to the Central Area Planning Commission should call **1 669-900-9128** and use Meeting ID No. **962 0089 3998** and then press #. Press # again when prompted for participant ID.

Pursuant to the Commission's general operating procedures, the Commission at times must necessarily limit the speaking times of those presenting testimony on either side of an issue that is designated as a public hearing item. In all instances, however, equal time is allowed for presentation of pros and cons of matters to be acted upon.

Materials must be emailed to [apccentral@lacity.org](mailto:apccentral@lacity.org). **Secondary Submissions** in response to a Staff Recommendation Report or additional comments must be received electronically no later than 48-hours before the Commission meeting. Submissions shall not exceed ten (10) pages, including exhibits, and must be submitted electronically to [apccentral@lacity.org](mailto:apccentral@lacity.org). Photographs do not count toward the page limitation. **Day of Hearing Submissions** within 24 hours of the meeting, up to and including the day of the meeting are limited to 2 pages plus accompanying photographs and must be submitted electronically to [apccentral@lacity.org](mailto:apccentral@lacity.org). Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped "**File Copy. Non-Complying Submission.**" Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission, and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case. **PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED**

**PROJECT SITE:** 1717-1719 North Winona Boulevard

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Demolition of an existing four unit residential building and the construction, use, and maintenance of a new five-story, with a partially subterranean parking level, 54-foot in height, 15-unit, apartment building within Subarea A (Neighborhood Conservation) of the Vermont/Western Station Neighborhood Area Plan (SNAP).

**REQUESTED ACTION(S):**

1. Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(b), consideration of the whole of the administrative record, including the Negative Declaration, Case No. ENV-2019-2049-ND (“Negative Declaration”), and all comments received, that there is no substantial evidence that the project will have a significant effect on the environment; FIND the Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment and analysis of the City; and ADOPT the Negative Declaration
2. Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 12.22 A.31, a Transit Oriented Communities (TOC) Affordable Housing Incentive Program consisting of Base Incentives including a seven (7) percent increase in density, 12 percent increase in Floor Area Ratio (FAR), 0.5 residential parking spaces per unit consistent with the provisions of the Transit Oriented Communities (TOC) Affordable Housing Incentive Program for a qualifying Tier 3 project totaling 15 dwelling units, reserving one (1) unit for Extremely Low Income Household occupancy and two (2) units for Very Low Income Household occupancy for a period of 55 years, with the following two (2) Additional Incentives:
  - a. Height. A 10-foot increase in height to permit 54 feet of maximum transitional building height in lieu of the maximum 44 feet otherwise permitted in Subarea A and a nine-foot increase in height to permit 54 feet of maximum building height in lieu of the maximum 45 feet otherwise permitted per the underlying zone;
  - b. Side Yards. A 30 percent reduction to permit a northerly and southerly side yard of 5 feet, 6 inches in lieu of the minimum eight (8) feet otherwise required;
3. Pursuant to LAMC Section 11.5.7 F, a Specific Plan Exception from Section 7.E of the Vermont/Western SNAP to allow a 15-foot building setback in lieu of the otherwise required 44-foot building setback; and
4. Pursuant to Section 11.5.7 C of the LAMC, a Project Permit Compliance to allow the demolition of an existing four (4) unit residential building and the construction, use, and maintenance of a new five-story with a partial subterranean level, 15-unit, residential building located within Subarea A of the SNAP.

**PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED**

**PROJECT SITE:** 950 East 3rd Street Unit 1A (930-950 East 3<sup>rd</sup> Street & 875 Traction Avenue)

**PROPOSED PROJECT:**

A Master Plan Approval to permit the sale and dispensing of beer and wine for on- and off-site consumption, in conjunction with a proposed 2,415 square-foot microbrewery/bar (Mumford Brewing) with seating for 112 patrons indoors and a 776 square-foot outdoor patio with seating for 50 patrons outdoors. Proposed hours of operation are from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., daily.

**APPEAL:**

An appeal in part of the February 28, 2020, Zoning Administrator's determination which:

1. Determined, based on the whole of the administrative record, that the Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15301, and that there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to a categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2, applies;
2. Approved, pursuant to Section 12.24 M of the Los Angeles Municipal Code, a Conditional Use Permit to allow a Master Plan Approval to permit the sale and dispensing of beer and wine for on- and off-site consumption, in conjunction with the operation of a microbrewery/bar.

## Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the CA is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
