LOS ANGELES UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

PROPOSED RULES ON PUBLIC COMMENT FOR PUBLIC INPUT HEARINGS

1. The Los Angeles Unified School District Redistricting Commission (“Commission”) will be holding special Public Input Hearings to solicit and receive public comment on the subject of redistricting Board of Education districts. These Public Input Hearings are in addition to the regular and special meetings of the Commission. The Commission has adopted these rules governing public comment at the Public Input Hearings to facilitate the receipt of public input in an orderly and efficient manner.

2. The Commission shall make every effort to post the agenda for each Public Input Hearing at least five days before the hearing. The agenda shall contain a brief general description of the items of business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting and otherwise comply with the Ralph M. Brown Act.

3. The Commission shall provide an opportunity at the Public Input Hearings for members of the public to address the Commission on agenda items for three minutes per speaker, plus additional time to translate comments by non-English speakers. The Presiding Officer may allot fewer than three minutes per speaker if the number of members of the public wishing to speak is too numerous for the total time available or for other good reason, such as, for example, the Commission being in danger of losing a quorum. The Presiding Officer shall make every effort to notify the public at the beginning of the Hearing of limitations on the time available for public comment at that Hearing.

4. The Presiding Officer may rule that a speaker is out-of-order if the speaker's comments are not germane to the items under consideration or are overly repetitive. If the speaker remains out-of-order, the Presiding Officer may declare the speaker is impeding the orderly conduct of the meeting, rule the remainder of the speaker's time forfeit, and order the speaker to return promptly and quietly to the person's seat. If the speaker does not do so, the speaker is disrupting the meeting.

5. No person in the audience at a Public Input Hearing shall engage in conduct that disrupts the orderly conduct of the hearing, including, but are not limited to: shouting, whistling, clapping, stamping of feet, repeated waiving of arms or otherwise acting in a way that may distract the Commissioners or other members of the public. Additionally, members of the audience shall not display placards, banners, props or similar items that are larger than 8½ by 11 inches, are illuminated, or are attached to a pole, stick or other device; or raise placards, banners or props, or wear hats, costumes, or other items that obstruct the view of other audience members. The Presiding Officer may issue a warning to a member of the public disrupting a meeting. If the person, or any person present during the warning, continues to disrupt the meeting, the Presiding Officer may order that person to leave the meeting promptly and quietly. If the person does not do so, the Presiding Officer may order the Sergeant-at-Arms to remove the person from the remainder of the meeting.

6. The public comment procedures set forth in this rule are in addition to any other requirements specifically imposed by law.
