## Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay

service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long-distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the CA is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service . . ." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

#### **Roll Call**

A quorum of the Commission was established with 12 members present.

#### **Disclosure of Ex Parte Communications**

Commissioner Elizabeth Johnson disclosed that on Aug. 31, 2021 at 6:00pm she spoke to Carolyn Fowler who is the Executive Assistant to Dr. McKenna. Commissioner Johnson shared with Mrs. Fowler that she will be in the AdHoc committee and be part of looking at the mapping concepts for the Commission.

Commissioner Antonio Sanchez disclosed that on August 31, 2021 at 11:00am he contacted the office of Board President Kelly Gonez and spoke to the Chief of Staff. Commissioner Sanchez indicated that he shared the LAUSD Redistricting Commission meeting schedule and gave an update of the previous meeting conducted.

Executive Director, Andrew Westall shared a slide presentation which shows the informational report and overall District Statistics. Commissioner Ana Teresa- Dahan, Vice Chair Andrea Ambriz and Commissioner Kristie Hernandez shared information that was discussed at their AdHoc Committee meetings and shared their report to the whole Commission.

The Commission asked questions and shared their thoughts and suggestions to to include in the presentation for the next Commission meeting.

No action was taken on this item and the LAUSD Redistricting staff will put all the draft map or maps concepts together and present it at the next meeting scheduled for Friday, Sept. 17, 2021.

Item No. (3) **Presentation and Commission discussion and possible action on the Outreach Director's Report.**

Outreach Director, Genesis Coronado presented the outreach report to the Commission and discussed the strategies overview which included various outreach efforts to engage the community. The Outreach Director has partnered up with Elected Officials, Los Angeles City Council Offices,

Neighborhood Councils, Labor Organizations as well as community based organizations and the Los Angeles Unified School District. The Outreach director also shared that there will be a mapping workshop and will work with community-based organizations to encourage as many groups to draft their own maps. The Commission asked questions and shared their thoughts and ideas to help get the information out to the community.

A quorum of the Commission was established with 12 members present.

Executive Director, Andrew Westall mentioned that the Commission received one community impact statement from the Westside Neighborhood Council. No representatives joined the meeting.

#### **Agenda Item/Multiple Agenda Item Public Comment**

Executive Assistant Gladys Espinoza announced the call-in information for public comment and the City Attorney communicated the public speaking rules for members of the public. The Commission received public comment from members of the public who identified as Puppet, Kaelen Perrochet, Rob Quan, Karina Macias, Hon. Eddie De La Riva and Eddie Martinez.

#### **Items Noticed for Public Hearing**

##### **Item No. (1) Map presentations by individuals or organized groups.**

There were no map presentations from any individuals or groups.

##### **Item No. (2) Staff presentation and Commission discussion on concept maps and accompanying data, including possible action on direction to staff for the development of a draft map or maps.**

Executive Director, Andrew Westall introduced the ArcBridge team who

reported on the different map concepts that the Commission was looking for. Priti Mathur from ArcBridge shared a slide presentation that provided an overview and details of the 2 map concepts that were developed from the directions of the AdHoc Committee. The Commissioners asked questions regarding the map concepts and made recommendations and made some minor corrections.

Commissioner Elizabeth Johnson proposed to move the two map concepts for District 1 forward. Commissioner Kristie Hernandez seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted and the proposed two concepts for District 1 passed unanimously.

Commissioner Antonio Sanchez proposed to have the section west of the 405 to include Monroe High School in District 6. Commissioner Wendy Greuel seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted and passed with a 11 to 0 vote with 1 abstention.

Commissioner Wendy Greuel proposed to move the two map concepts for District 3 forward. Commissioner Antonio Sanchez seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted and the proposed two map concepts for District 3 passed unanimously on a 12 to 0 vote.

Commissioner Wendy Greuel proposed to move the two map concepts for District 4 forward. Commissioner Elizabeth Johnson seconded the motion. A roll call vote conducted and the proposed two map concepts for District 4 passed unanimously on a 12 to 0 vote.

Commissioner Wilma Franco proposed to have a third draft map concept for District 2 and District 5. Commissioner Heather Repenning seconded the motion. A roll call was conducted and the proposal to have a third map concept for District 2 and District 5 passed on a 12 to 0 vote.

Item No. (3) **Staff to report and Commission discussion and possible action on adding a Commission meeting in October after the Public Input Hearings and before the publication of the proposed final map recommendation.**

Executive Director, Andrew Westall recommended to add a Commission meeting on Wednesday October 13, 2021 at 4:00pm.

Commissioner Gil Hurtado motioned to approve the recommended date. Commissioner Ana Teresa-Dahan seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted and the recommended date was approved unanimously on a 12 to 0 vote.

Item No. (4) **Executive Director's report.**

Executive Director, Andrew Westall stated that staff is continuing to develop

contingency plans in case the LAUSD Redistricting Commission would have to start meeting in public.

Item No. (5) **Commission discussion of future agenda items.**

Commissioner Kristie Hernandez made a recommendation to have staff provide a demonstration on the mapping tools to help make sure that our community knows how to navigate that tool. This will also show the Commission how the mapping tools are coming along on the website. Executive Director, Andrew Westall mentioned that the online mapping tool is now on the website along with an instruction booklet that was put together by staff.

Vice Chair Ambriz suggested that it would be helpful to go over the feeder school information that was received by the Executive Director from LAUSD in today's meeting and see how that could be overlaid with the proposed concept maps that were discussed.
