## Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long-distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the CA is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service . . ." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

**Roll Call**

A quorum of the Commission was established with 12 members present.

**Disclosure of Ex Parte Communications**

Commissioner Ana Teresa-Dahan disclosed that on Monday, October 11, 2021, at 8:30am She spoke to Ackley Padilla, Chief of staff from Council President Nury Martinez’ office. Commissioner Dahan provided an update on the process and where the Commission is at now after the last public input meeting. On Wednesday October 13, 2021 at 10:00am Commissioner Dahan had a follow up call with Council President Nury Martinez’ Chief of Staff Ackley Padilla to answer a question that was raised regarding the last input meeting.

**Discussion with Neighborhood Council Representatives on Neighborhood Council Resolutions or Community Impact Statements filed with the City Clerk relative to any item listed or being considered on this agenda for the Los Angeles Unified School District Redistricting Commission,**

Executive Director, Andrew Westall mentioned that the Commission received an updated community impact letter from Westside Community Neighborhood. No representatives joined the meeting.

**Agenda Item/Multiple Agenda Item Public Comment and General Public Comment**

Gladys Espinoza, who is the Commission Executive Assistant for the LAUSD Redistricting Commission, announced the call-in information for public comment and the City Attorney communicated the public speaking rules to members of the public. The Commission received public comment from members of the public who identified as Brenda Ortega, Henry Perez, Brigitte Plascencia, Jasmine Garcia, Garry Fordyce, Graciela Ortiz, Jessica Panduro, Karina Macias, Hon. Eddie De La Riva, Omar Quinonez, Oscar Magana and Ana Godoy.

## **Items Noticed for Public Hearing**

### **Item No. (1) Approval of the Minutes for the meetings of September 29, 2021.**

Commissioner Wendy Greuel motioned to adopt the minutes.  
Commissioner Andrea Ambriz seconded the approval of minutes. A roll call was conducted and the minutes were approved.

### **Item No. (2) Map presentations by individuals or organized group.**

Resident Sarah Roos presented maps to the Commission on behalf of herself and Dr. Manuel Urrutia. The Commission asked questions and shared their thoughts and suggestions regarding the maps that were presented. The Commission also thanked the individuals who took their time and participate in the mapping process.

### **Item No. (3) Commission discussion on the draft maps on public input, including possible Action on direction to staff for development of proposed final map Recommendation.**

The Commission asked questions and shared their thoughts and suggestions regarding recommendations to the draft maps.

Commissioner Wendy Greuel motioned to a friendly amendment in relationship to Board Districts 3 and 4. Board District 4 would keep Encino and Tarzana and go up to make Reseda whole as reflected in map draft 1A and 1B with the caveat that if this decision becomes a hinderance to resolving other issues the Commission can re-evaluate this decision and make changes to it. Commissioner Antonio Sanchez seconded the motion. A roll call vote was Conducted and it passed with an 8 yes to 3 no vote and 1 abstention.

Commissioner Barry Waite motioned to keep Gardena whole in Board District 7 with the caveat that if this decision becomes a hinderance to resolving other issues, the Commission can re-evaluate and make changes to it. Commissioner Ana Teresa Dahan seconded that motion. A roll Call vote was conducted, and it was approved unanimously. 11 yes to 0 no vote.

Chair Luis Sanchez motioned to add the rest of the population of Los Feliz in the Marshall High School attendance zone in District 2 to District 5; add all the of the population of Angelino Heights and Chinatown from District 2 to keep the Belmont High School attendance zone whole in District 5; add the rest of the population of the RFK Community of School attendance zone in District 5 to keep it whole in District 2; add all the population in District 5 in the West Adams Prep High School attendance zone to District 2; and, move the northern boundary of District 7 south of Vernon Avenue to 51<sup>st</sup> Street to balance the population.

Commissioner Barry Waite seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted and it was approved unanimously.

Andrew Westall, Executive Director presented a pdf map that the Commission received from Huntington Park Councilmember Karina Macias. It is not a full map and it only deals with issues in Board Districts 7, 2 and 5 with a section of District 4. The suggestions for map 1A are to move Hollywood Hills, East Hollywood, Los Feliz and Griffith Park to Board District 4; move Koreatown and Florence-Firestone to Board District 5; move Downtown to Board District 2 only if needed for numbers. This map does not provide any indication on what she would do in Board District 7.

The Commissioners then asked questions and shared their thoughts and concerns on the draft map suggestions.

Commissioner Wilma Franco motioned to drop draft map 2. Commissioner Gil Hurtado seconded the motion. A roll call vote was conducted, and it did not pass. With a 4 yes to 7 no vote.

The Commission will continue with the remaining items of today's agenda and draft map discussion on the next Commission meeting scheduled for October 20, 2021.

The meeting was then adjourned.
