In accordance with Government Code Section 54953, subsections (e)(1) and (e)(3), and in light of the State of Emergency originally proclaimed by the Governor on March 4, 2020 relating to COVID-19 and ongoing concerns that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees and/or that the State of Emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person, the July 20, 2022, meeting of the Emergency Operations Board will be conducted entirely telephonically. EOB members and staff will also have access to video teleconferencing capabilities. Until further notice, meetings will not be conducted at the EOB Boardroom, 500 E. Temple Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012.

Members of the public can listen to the meeting via telephone and are invited to address the EOB on any item on the agenda prior to action by the Board on that specific item by calling **346-248-7799**. Public participants will be asked for a meeting ID, and should enter **81804562773** followed by the # (pound sign). Participants should then press # (pound sign) again to continue. Participants wishing to provide public comment should press *9 and will be called on by the meeting moderator (EOB Executive Assistant).

Public comment will be limited to two (2) minutes per individual for each item addressed, unless there are more than ten (10) comment requests for each item, in which case the Board Chair may limit public comment to one (1) minute per individual. Time cannot be ceded to another speaker, and an individual may speak only once during any individual agenda item. Only those who are in the queue when the Board Chair begins public comment on a specific agenda item, or the General Public Comment item (if there is one) will be allowed to speak on that item.

(NOTE: Pursuant to Government Code Section 54954.3(b) the legislative body of a local agency may adopt reasonable regulations, including, but not limited to, regulations limiting the total amount of time allocated for public testimony on particular issues and for each individual speaker.)

It is requested that individuals who require the services of a translator contact the Executive Assistant to the Board at (213) 484-4821 no later than the day preceding the meeting. Whenever possible, a translator will be provided.

Sign language interpreters, assistive listening devices, or other auxiliary aids and/or services may be provided upon request. To ensure availability, you are advised to make your request at least 72 hours prior to the meeting you wish to attend.

If you are compensated to monitor, attend, or speak at this meeting, City law may require you to register as a lobbyist and report your activity. See Los Angeles Municipal Code §§ 48.01 et seq. RECOMMENDATION

SUMMARY

On June 30, 2021 at approximately 1930 hours, there was a major explosion in South Los Angeles due to the detonation of illegal fireworks and improvised explosive devices seized by LAPD. The City of Los Angeles EOC was activated at Level 3 to support the Unified Command Post resource requests, coordinate services for individuals and families affected by this incident, and to ensure coordination between multiple agencies.

Recommendation

That the Emergency Operations Board (EOB) approve the attached 2022 Los Angeles Marathon Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Activation After Action Report/Improvement Plan (AAR/IP) and forward it to the Mayor and the City Council as an informational item.

Summary

On Sunday, March 20, 2022, the Los Angeles Marathon commenced its 37th annual race. An estimated 14,647 athletes from all 50 states and over 78 countries registered for the event and approximately 11,973 crossed the starting line. The City of Los Angeles EOC was activated to provide support and coordination for the event.
