Submissions shall not exceed ten (10) pages, including exhibits, and must be submitted electronically to apceastla@lacity.org. Photographs do not count toward the page limitation. **Day of Hearing Submissions** within 24 hours of the meeting, up to and including the day of the meeting are limited to 2 pages plus accompanying photographs. Day of Hearing Submissions are to be submitted electronically to apceastla@lacity.org and 12 hard copies must be submitted at the in-person meeting. Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped "**File Copy. Non-Complying Submission.**" Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case. PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED

PROJECT SITE: 616 - 620 North Avenue 66

PROPOSED PROJECT:

A Vesting Tentative Tract Map for the merger and resubdivision of the subject property into a 12-lot small-lot subdivision for the construction, use, and maintenance of 11 small-lot residences (with one lot without a residential unit). The Project will rise to a maximum height of four stories and 57 feet in height. The Project proposes to provide a total of 24 vehicle parking spaces, including two spaces per unit and two guest parking spaces. The Project proposes to remove three protected trees on-site replacing them at a 4:1 ratio per the Urban Forestry regulations for protected trees. The Project also involves a haul route for the export of approximately 2,010 cubic yards of soil.

APPEAL:

An appeal of the June 6, 2019 Advisory Agency’s Determination which:

1. Determined, based on the whole of the administrative record, that the Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Article 19, Section 15332 (Class 32), and there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to a categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2 applies;
2. Approved, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 17.06, 17.15, and 12.22 C.27, Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 82095-SL to permit the merger and resubdivision of the subject property into a maximum of 13 lots for a new 12-unit small-lot subdivision in the RD2-1-HPOZ Zone; and
3. Adopted the Conditions of Approval and Findings.

Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
